Come finals time, there's sense of uncertainty, and companionship through shared stress that fills the air. These cafés have become a veritable oasis, being the ideal chill spot, or a place to study.

If you're an aspiring photographer or model, Montreal offers the most beautiful murals in any area, Graffmap helps you locate different art murals to help you find that perfect shot.





Montreal does not disappoint when it comes to providing for it's community in the Summer from a vast variety of activities and festivals for all ages to enjoy.






ARTIST WHATISADAM by will denman



Montreal's St-Laurent boulevard has almost synonymous with urban art; ornate works of graffiti that plaster just about every free wall available. They range from surreal to the political, these works make up Montreal's Mural Festival, a twoweek affair that transforms the boulevard into an urban gallery. Made up of mostly locally based artists, there is one that has reinvigorated Quebecois culture, with an urban twist.

With his deliciously vibrant comic book-style pop art, Montreal artist Whatisadam (WIA) takes traditional Quebec imagery (cabane-à-sucre, tuques), and douses it in tattoos. Glossy lover boys from Archie-style comics of old become burly lumberjacks, accompanied by a vixen in a poodle skirt with a maple leaf tramp stamp, of course.

Mysterious and nameless, WIA is inspired by the essence of Canada: the wilderness, "I'm very inspired by North American elements that are part of our culture—the wilderness, scenery, branches, deer, the natural elements but also the feminine aspects of nature", he says in an interview with Cult MTL. The inspiration is clear, as tattooed ducks and doe with pasties have become staples of his work. His most iconic is a famous maple syrup can, rebranded as maple 'sizzurp', all housed within his residency at the Station 16 art gallery. The aura mystique WIA keeps adds a layer of depth to his work, making it seems more other worldly yet reminiscent of time most have never known.

While his "indoor" work is rather crass, his murals often resemble vintage tattoos, with fixtures such as a butch Bettie Page-style character or a hoodlum Canadiens hockey player populating them.

And his scope isn't just limited to Montreal—he's had installation's in cities like Paris, New York, and Miami. Of course, not with our signature Quebecois style of course, but still style keeping the same gruff comic book nostalgia.

As for what's next with WIA, he continues keeps a low profile, but his work gets bigger.

Lachine Canal

VINTAGE BAZAAR




MARCHE AUX PUCES

Melrose Restro


